

Prenatal and hospital coordination

- Warm handover from Firefly Clinic to inpatient team
- Standardized approach for all infants with opioid exposure
- Eat Sleep Console and full rooming in
- Lactation consultant and peer recovery specialist involved
- Discharge checklist
- Referral to SHINE program




Support and Healing for Infants with Ante/Neonatal Exposure (SHINE)

A multidisciplinary follow up program for
patients exposed to opioids in utero from birth to six years of age.

Optimizing Neurodevelopmental Outcomes

- Embedded in Standard Well-Child Checks
 - Neurodevelopmental monitoring with Psychologist > further testing PRN
 - Screening with Peds Rehab at specific intervals
 - Speech Therapy, Physical Therapy, and Occupational Therapy
 - Social Work Assessment at specific intervals
 - Lactation Consultation PRN
 - Appropriate referrals based on screening and testing

Optimizing Neurodevelopmental Outcomes

- Consultative Pathway of Care
 - For Patients in Middle TN who do not use VUMC as medical home
 - Annual telehealth-based developmental screening > feedback provided
 - Additional Psychological assessment PRN
