STATEWIDE LEARNING COLLABORATIVE

The Best for ALL Learning Collaborative engages maternal and infant leaders from across the state to address the difference in perinatal health outcomes that continue to persist. By August of 2026, all teams aim to have 90% of all process & structure measures fully in place.

Of the 19 hospitals teams participating in the project:

- 84% have fully implemented a hospital and unit protocol for collecting disaggregated data
- 89% utilize a standardized screening tool to assess for social needs
- 95% have updated their postpartum discharge education

TIPQC trained 78 individuals from 35 different hospitals/organizations on trauma informed care, adverse childhood events, and handling sensitive topics.

55% of PREM Survey respondents leave a comment describing their care

“Staff are super respectful and caring. They let me ask questions. They asked questions and made sure there’s a good understanding of everything.”

“My son was in the Nicu and I felt like I was not included in his care and what was going on with him while he was in there and was just told that no news is good news when I asked why I was not being kept informed.”

“No one would explain why I was stuck in the hospital for a long time. I was uncomfortable. I felt like a pin cushion. I felt unheard.”

“Our birth was emergent and I was treated with so much compassion and respect by the staff. Our baby was well cared for and I felt seen and heard on all levels of care with any questions or concerns I had.”




Figure 1 shows participating teams' progress in achieving key process and structure measures established for the project. Currently, hospitals have 68.8% of all key process and structure measures (strategies) in place. This 2025 Report does not reflect the final compilation of data or improvement that continues to be ongoing.

Provider Education on Respectful Care	46.6%	85.1%
Hospital Protocol to Review Data by Demographics	56.2%	92.7%
Hospital Strategy to Share Respectful Care Practices	28.3%	85.0%
Process to Monitor Services Received via Positive Screening	50.0%	81.3%
