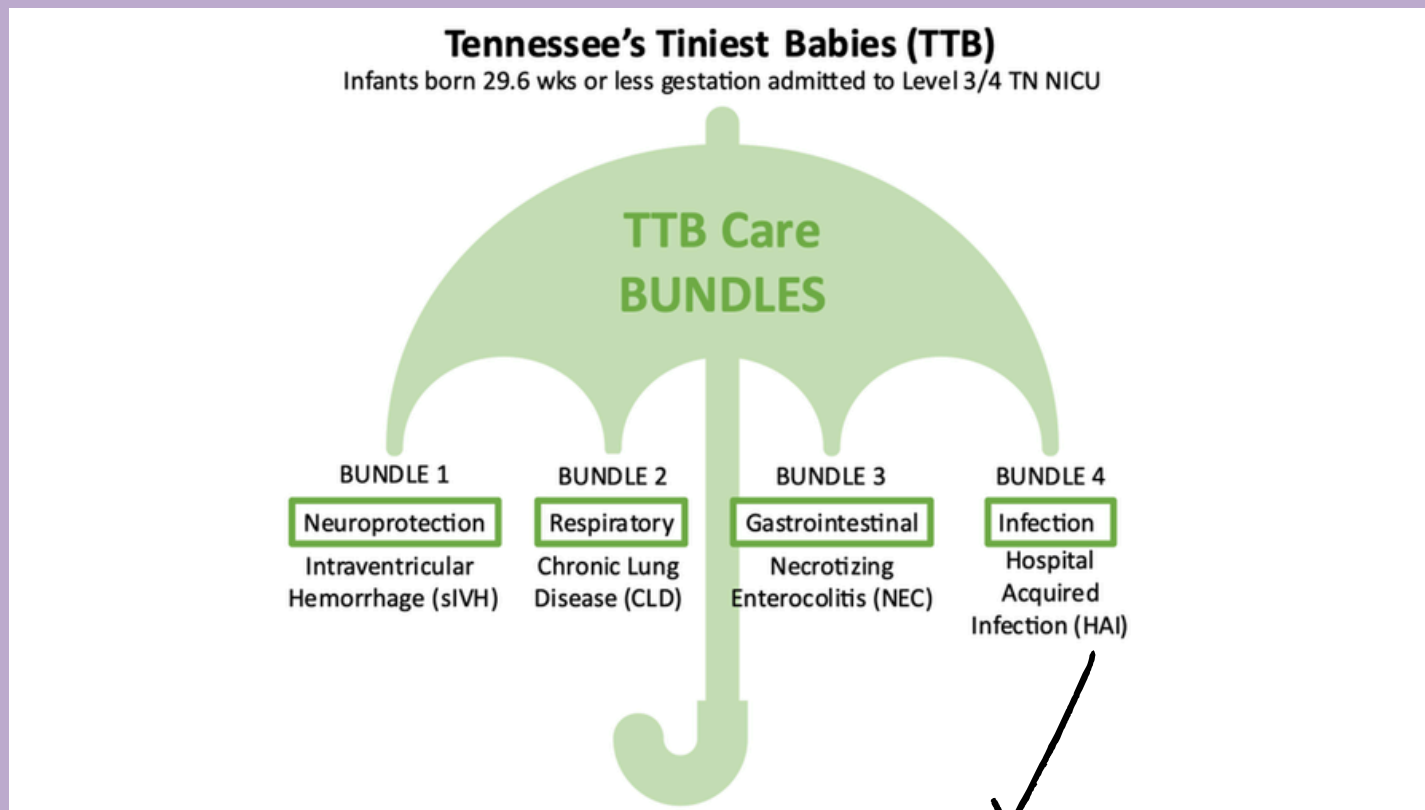


Tennessee's Tiniest Babies: Reducing Hospital Acquired Infections (HAI)

**Project AIM:
25% Reduction in HAIs**

Reduction of HAIs have been reported by NICUs who have implemented various quality improvement initiatives such as the use of central line insertion and maintenance bundles, standardized checklists, hand hygiene compliance monitoring, and multidisciplinary collaborative approaches, often achieving relative reductions in Central Line-associated Bloodstream Infection (CLABSI) rates of 60–80% and sustaining periods of zero infections in some units.
